**Interdependence – Can We Live It?**

**This event continues a long-running series of seminars Baker Roshi has been having with the Boulder community in a beautiful venue at the base of the Flatirons.**

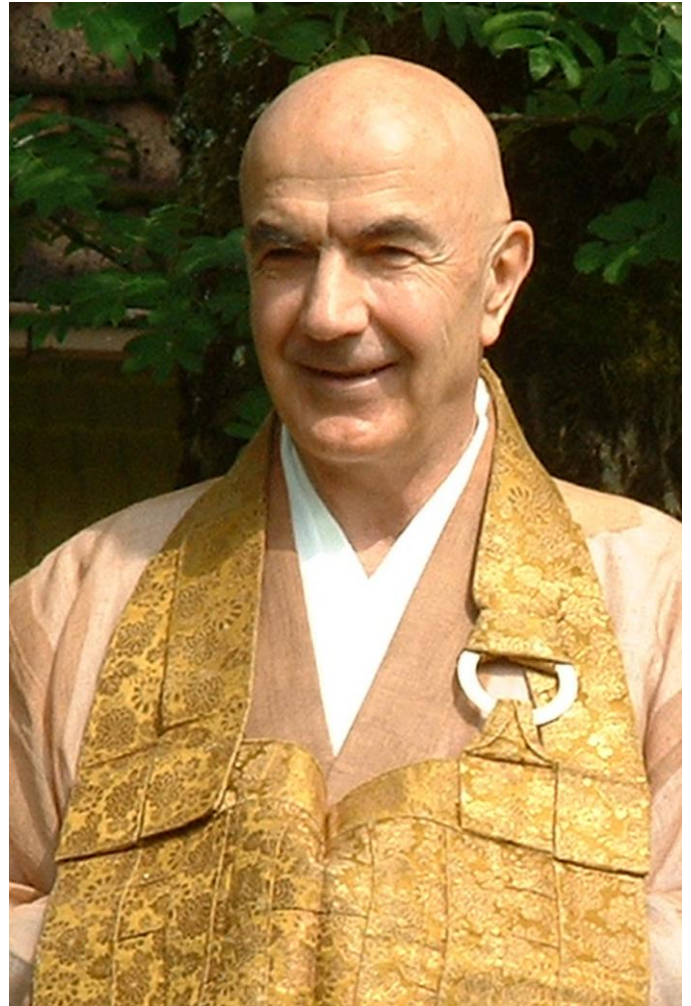
**Please join us for this ongoing exploration of the dharma.**

Zentatsu Baker Roshi is Abbot, Head Teacher, and founder of the Dharma Sangha centers in Europe and the United States. In the United States he lives at the Crestone Mountain Zen Center in Colorado; and in Germany, at the 'Buddhistisches Studienzentrum im Johanneshof' (Buddhist Study Center at Johanneshof) in the Black Forest.

He is the Dharma Successor of Shunryu Suzuki Roshi, the first Zen Master to establish residential and monastic practice for laypeople and monks in the West. In 1966, with and for Suzuki Roshi, Baker Roshi co-founded the Tassajara Zen Mountain Center in California, the first traditional Zen monastery outside of Asia.

From 1968 to 1971, he studied in Japan at Antaiji, Eiheiiji, and Daitokuji Zen monasteries. He became Suzuki Roshi's Dharma Heir in 1969 and was installed by Suzuki Roshi as the second Abbot of the San Francisco Zen Center in 1971.

Baker Roshi has committed his life to discovering and cultivating a way that combines monastic practice, community life, and the study of the interrelationship between Asian and Western cultural practices.



***This seminar is co-sponsored by Dharma Sangha Boulder (Boulder Zen Center) and the Colorado Chautauqua Association. It will be held at the Chautauqua Community House at the base of the Flatirons. The format for the weekend will include lectures, questions & answers, group discussion, and some sitting meditation. It is not necessary for participants to have experience with Zen practice, or familiarity with Baker Roshi's previous seminars. The weekend seminar will begin Saturday morning at 9:30 A.M., extending to late afternoon on Saturday and Sunday. The cost for the two days is \$125. While the main seminar will begin on Saturday, Baker-roshi will begin to develop the topic of the seminar on Friday from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm with those who are able to attend. The price for all three days is \$175. To those who can, we ask that you bring a sitting cushion and mat.***
